KEY FINDINGS FOR AUGUST 2015

MONTHLY CHANGES IN THE CPAP INDICES

In August 2015, month-on-month percentage changes in the work group indices ranged from -2,7% for work group 172 to 0,8% for work group 118. The Consumer Price Index for August 2015 remained unchanged month-on-month.

The four indices reflecting monthly percentage changes mainly due to factors other than the headline CPI are:

- **Work group 118:** The monthly percentage increase of 0,8% reflected by this index was mainly due to a 2,1% monthly increase in the PPI Natural stone, cut and sawn, which accounts for approximately 54,0% of the work group 118 index.
- **Work group 162:** The monthly percentage decrease of 2,4% reflected by this index was mainly due to a 4,9% monthly decrease in SEIFSA for Metal prices – Copper 7,9mm Rod, which accounts for approximately 45,0% of the work group 162 index.
- **Work group 160:** The monthly percentage decrease of 2,4% reflected by this index was mainly due to a 4,9% monthly decrease in SEIFSA for Metal prices – Copper 7,9mm Rod, which accounts for approximately 35,0% of the work group 160 index.
- **Work group 172:** The monthly percentage decrease of 2,7% reflected by this index was mainly due to a 5,2% monthly decrease in SEIFSA for Metal prices – Copper RCP/ Metric Ton, which accounts for approximately 40,0% of the work group 172 index.
