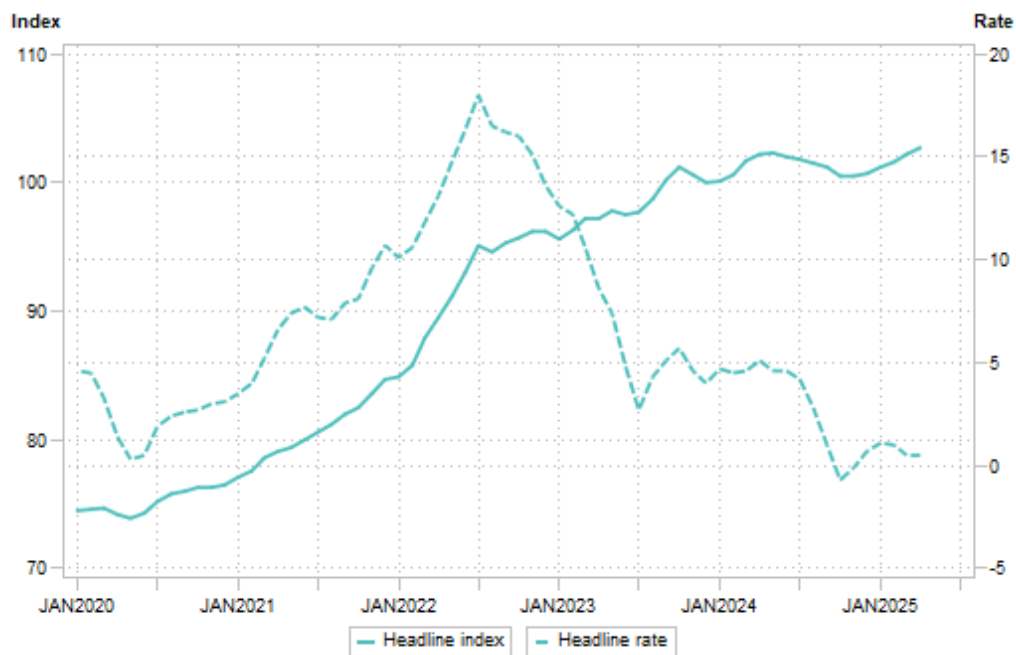
Final manufactured goods – headline PPI

Annual producer price inflation (final manufacturing) was 0,5% in April 2025, unchanged from March 2025. The producer price index (PPI) increased by 0,5% month-on-month in April 2025.

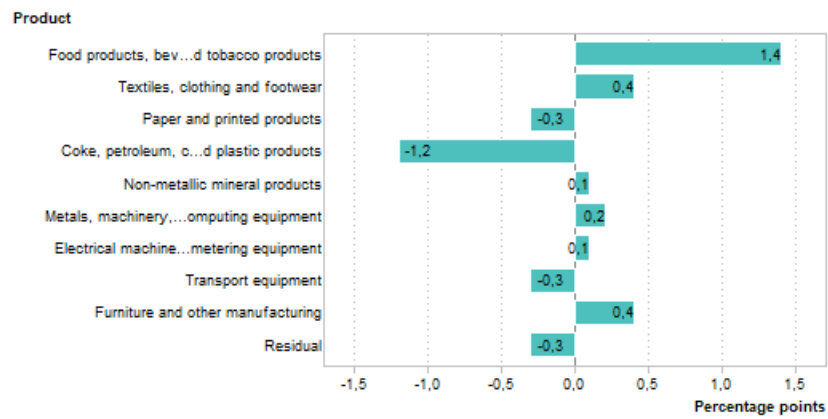
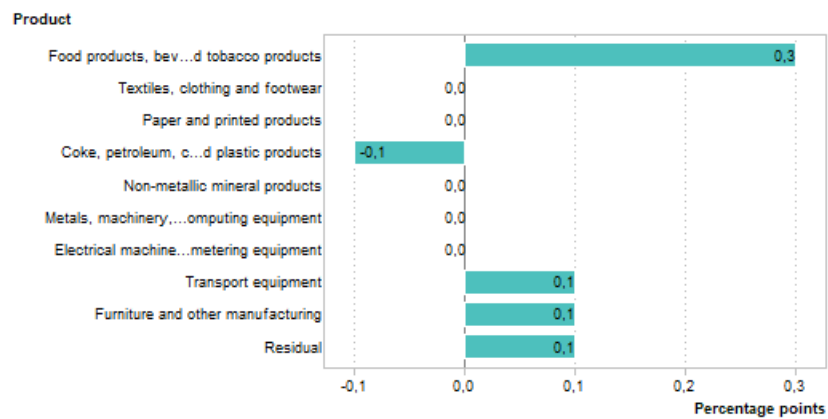
Figure 1.1 – Contributions to the annual percentage change in PPI for final manufactured goods**Figure 1.2 – Contributions to the monthly percentage change in PPI for final manufactured goods**

The main positive contributor to the headline PPI annual inflation rate was food products, beverages and tobacco products (4,7% and contributing 1,4 percentage points) – see Figure 1.1.

The main positive contributor to the monthly rate was food products, beverages and tobacco products (0,9% and contributing 0,3 of a percentage point) – see Figure 1.2.

Intermediate manufactured goods

The annual percentage change in the PPI for intermediate manufactured goods was 8,5% in April 2025, compared with 7,4% in March 2025. The index increased by 2,4% month-on-month.

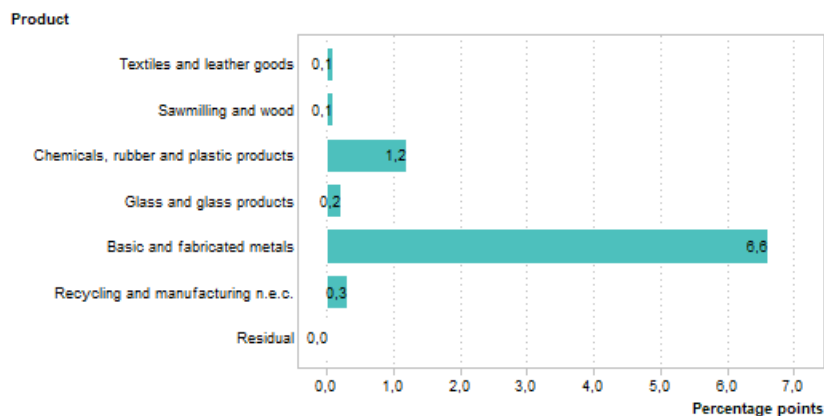
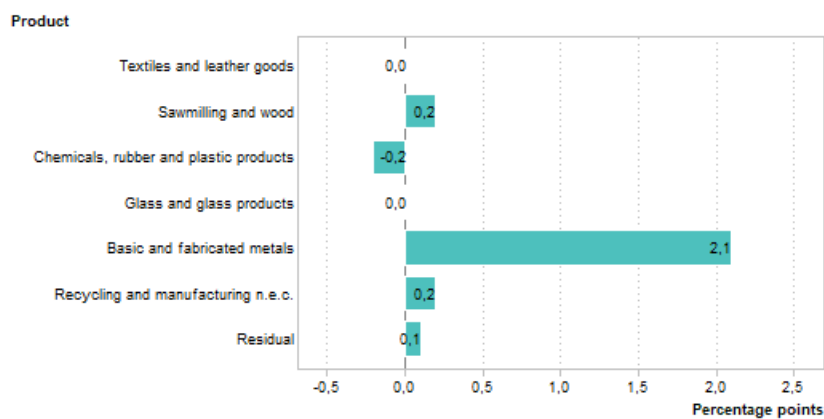
Figure 2.1 – Contributions to the annual percentage change in PPI for intermediate manufactured goods**Figure 2.2 – Contributions to the monthly percentage change in PPI for intermediate manufactured goods**

The main contributors to the annual rate were basic and fabricated metals (13,2% and contributing 6,6 percentage points) and chemicals, rubber and plastic products (4,2% and contributing 1,2 percentage points) – see Figure 2.1.

The main contributor to the monthly rate was basic and fabricated metals (4,2% and contributing 2,1 percentage points) – see Figure 2.2.

Electricity and water

The annual percentage change in the PPI for electricity and water was 11,2% in April 2025, compared with 10,0% in March 2025. The index increased by 6,4% month-on-month.

The contributors to the annual rate were electricity (12,5% and contributing 10,7 percentage points) and water (4,6% and contributing 0,7 of a percentage point) – see Figure 3.1.

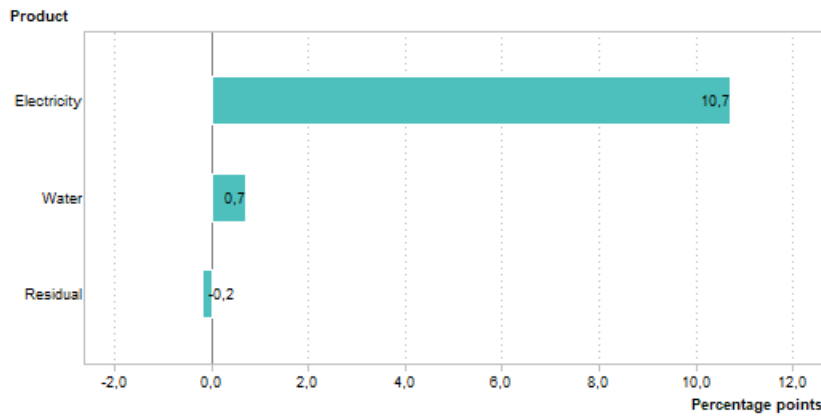


Figure 3.2 – Contributions to the monthly percentage change in PPI for electricity and water

The contributors to the monthly rate were electricity (7,3% and contributing 6,3 percentage points) and water (1,1% and contributing 0,2 of a percentage point) – see Figure 3.2.

Mining

The annual percentage change in the PPI for mining was 4,1% in April 2025, compared with 5,9% in March 2025. The index increased by 3,2% month-on-month.

The positive contributors to the annual rate were:

- gold and other metal ores (21,7% and contributing 5,8 percentage points);
- non-ferrous metal ores (2,9% and contributing 1,5 percentage points); and

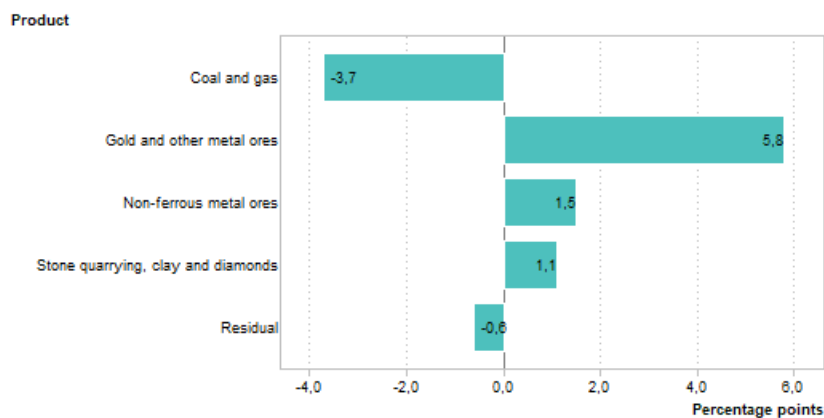
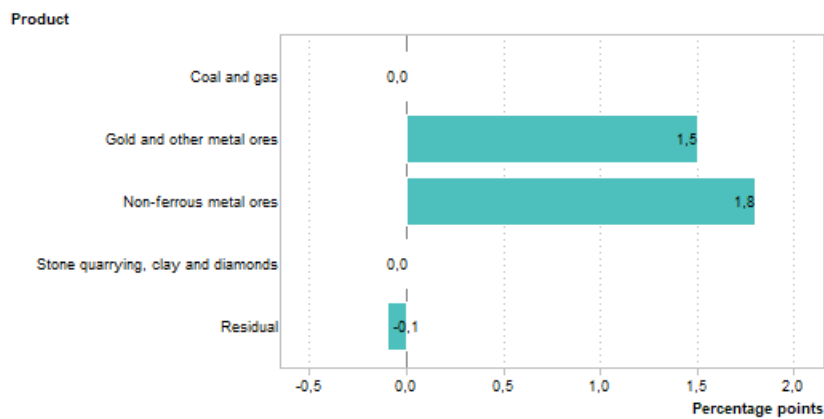
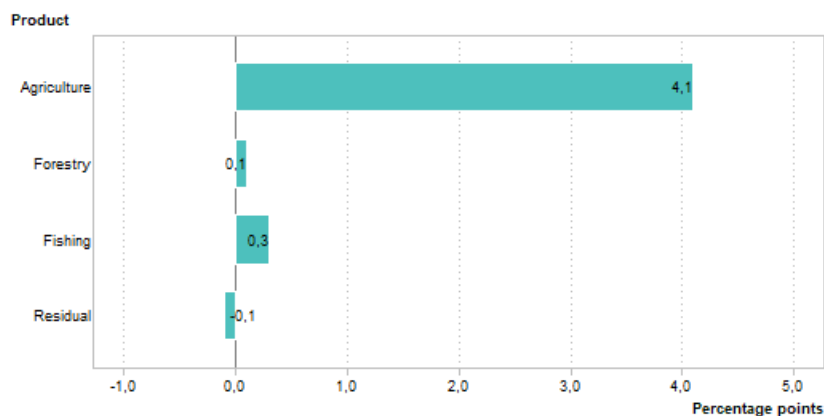
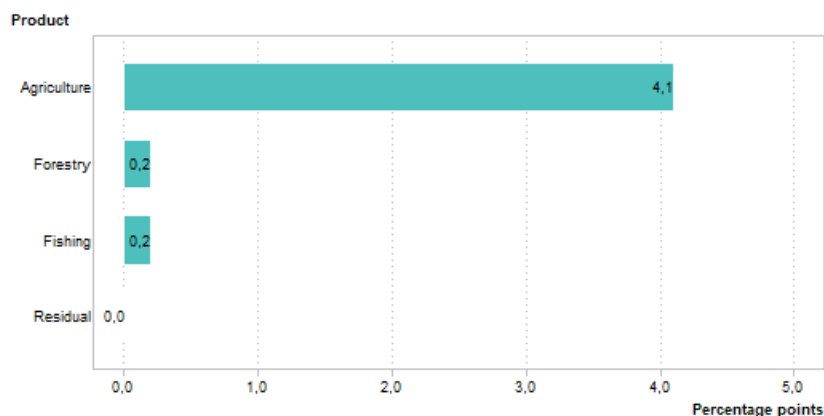
Figure 4.1 – Contributions to the annual percentage change in PPI for mining**Figure 4.2 – Contributions to the monthly percentage change in PPI for mining**

- stone quarrying, clay and diamonds (26,0% and contributing 1,1 percentage points) – see Figure 4.1.

The main contributors to the monthly rate were non-ferrous metal ores (3,7% and contributing 1,8 percentage points) and gold and other metal ores (4,9% and contributing 1,5 percentage points) – see Figure 4.2.

Agriculture, forestry and fishing

The annual percentage change in the PPI for agriculture, forestry and fishing was 4,4% in April 2025, compared with 2,4% in March 2025. The index increased by 4,5% month-on-month.

The main contributor to the annual rate was agriculture (4,7% and contributing 4,1 percentage points) – see Figure 5.1.

The main contributor to the monthly rate was agriculture (4,7% and contributing 4,1 percentage points) – see Figure 5.2.

Figure 3.1 – Contributions to the annual percentage change in PPI for electricity and water

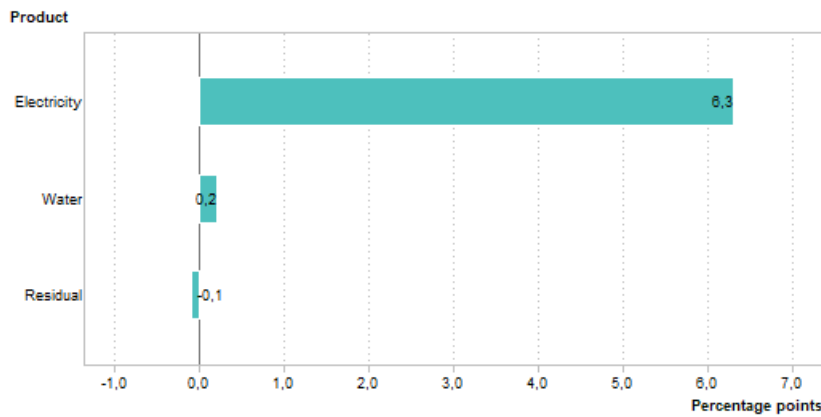

Explanatory notes

Purpose and results of the survey	The Producer Price Index (PPI) measures changes in the prices of locally produced commodities. A sample of producers is surveyed each month and the results of this survey are used to compile the producer price indices for final manufactured goods, intermediate manufactured goods, electricity and water, mining, and agriculture, forestry and fishing. PPI can be used as an economic indicator of inflation, as an escalator in contracts and as a deflator in the calculation of the national accounts. Further information on the weighting structure, sources of information and methods of compilation of PPI can be found in the PPI sources and methods document, available on the Stats SA website.
Response rate	The response rate for April 2025 was 97,9%.

Glossary

Annual inflation rate	The annual inflation rate per specific PPI is the change in the specific PPI for all items of the relevant month of the current year compared with the specific PPI for all items of the same month in the previous year expressed as a percentage.
Annual percentage change	The annual percentage change is the change in the index of the relevant month of the current year compared with the index of the same month in the previous year expressed as a percentage.
Average annual inflation rate	The average annual inflation rate is the change in the average specific PPI for all items of one year compared with the average specific PPI for all items of the previous year expressed as a percentage.
Average annual percentage change	The average annual percentage change is the change in the average index of one year compared with the average index of the previous year expressed as a percentage.
Contribution	The monthly (annual) contribution of a specific product or group of products to the specific PPI is calculated by multiplying the weight of this product or group of products with the difference of the current index and the previous month (year) index for this product or group of products, divided by the index for the specific index, for the previous month (year).
Monthly percentage change	The monthly percentage change is the change in the specific PPI of the relevant month compared with the specific PPI of the previous month expressed as a percentage.
Producer Price Index	PPI is defined as “A measure of the change in the prices of goods either as they leave their place of production or as they enter the production process” (OECD, 2006).”
